GREAT LOSSES ON DRESS COAT CONTRACTS

Philadelphia, July 10.—The Public Ledger tomorrow will say that work on 200,000 dress coats, contracted for through the Schuylkill arsenal here, has been stopped by a peremptory order of Quartermaster General Humphreys in Washington, and that a thorough investigation of the affairs at the arsenal has been begun.

"Continuing, the Ledger will say:

"Because of conditions under which contracts are given out at the arsenal nearly half of the dress coats in question have been manufactured and paid for. They lie idle in the storeroom of the depot, and in the opinion of experts of the government who have examined them, are absolutely worthless for the purpose they were originally intended. A contract for about 1,000 pairs of dress trousers is in the hands of the manufacturers. Stoppage on this work also is expected within a few days. It is believed that the investigation which has been started will show that the government has lost to the extent of millions of dollars by the methods it vague here."

HALIFAX GARRISON.

Question of Taking It Over Discussed in Dominion Parliament.

Ottawa, Ont., July 11.—The question of taking over the Halifax and Esquimalt garrisons by the Dominion government from the imperial authorities has been discussed in parliament.

Sir Frederick Borden, minister of militia, denied that Canada had any importance, the question of the garrisons, which depend upon Great Britain being ready to defend her eastern possessions and at the same time take part in any affair nearer home, either of which necessitated the placing in the field of an army as large and efficient as that of any of the European countries, all of which might be regarded as nations in embryo.

Every other European country regarded its army as part of the nation while England considered her army to be something else outside the national life and thought was bestowed upon it by the civil population except as part of a political and partisan platform.

He appealed to the country to awake to its danger and to take hold of the army as a great national basis on which the existence of Great Britain depended. He said the whole empire must rise to the occasion and that every one must personify his duty, share in the defense or renounce those to whom authority was delegated to become fit respects efficient.
