with the adverse report.

Executive Proclamation.—Internal
Revenue Receipts.

WASHINGTON, 29.—The Presi-
dent, under the provisions of the
act extending the Newfoundland
provisions of the treaty of Wash-
ington, the products of the Newfound-
land fisheries have been admitted into
the U. S. free of duty after the 1st
of June next.

The internal revenue receipts for
the year 1873-74, for the first
time, are in excess of the outgo,
for the fiscal year the receipts will
be a hundred millions.

WASATCH, 29.—An emigrant
