In Court to be Arraigned for Murder.

CARRIED IN UNCONSCIOUS.

Sank into a Swoon in the Sheriff's Office.

RETURNED TO JAIL UNRECOVERED.

Several Hours' Life and Death Struggle Could Not be Arranged—A Patient and Unconscious Victim.

An effort to arraign Mrs. Hamilton on the charge of the murder of her husband proved futile today on account of her condition. Pursuant to the order of the court, Judge Noyes, at the request of the county physician, Dr. J. H. Noyes, to bring her physician in an attempt to resuscitate her.

The whole of an hour was taken up after court opened this morning by the physician who consulted together to determine whether or not Mrs. Hamilton's health was such as to admit of her attending court. It was finally decided that it would not impair or injure her health by her being taken to court.

The decision of the county physician was sent to County Attorney V. A. Noyes, who informed the court of the status of the case, when his honor gave the order, that the prisoner be sent for.
