Of the six largest sugar-producing countries of Europe, Germany this year carries off the palm, with 800,000 tons, or 89 per cent. of the whole. Next come Austria with 475,000 tons, France with 435,000, Russia with 250,-000, Belgium with 75,000 and Holland with 25,000. Germany has not only the greatest number of refineries, 357 out of 1,204, but the largest also.

Irish land shows a continuous ten-dency to go out of cultivation, the area under all crops being this year but 15,-151,230 acres, as against 16,212,390 hast year, and 15,304,235 the year before. The decline extends allke to cors, green crops, flax and rotation grasses, and even potatoes occupy 30,000 acres less than in 1882. The decrease in the area under wheat is enormous, amount-ing to no less than 58,000 acres, or near-ly 38 per cent.
