Running at Large. The attention of the inhabitants of Salt Lake City is respectfully Platform Spring Wagons, just directed to the following extracts from ordinances of said city now in

Trespass, and concerning animals running at large, Chap, XLI, Revised Ordinances:

Sec. 2—No cattle, horses, mules, sheep, goats or hogs shall be allowed to run at large within the limits of this city, and all such animals, so found, may be taken up by any person and driven to the pound, and the owner of said animal shall be liable to pay a fine in any sum not exceeding \$10 for each animal, Crimes and punishments, Chap VII, Revised Ordinances: Sec. 38— \* and all fowl, such as turkeys, ducks,

and hens found running large at any time between the first Agricultural day of March and the lat day of October, shall be forfeited to and shall be liable to be killed by any berson upon whose premises they may be found trespassing.
