BOSTON CON.
MAY JOIN COLONYMay Abandon Plan to Install
Proposed Concentrating Mill
In Utah County.

SITE FOR IT NEAR GARFIELD.

Near American Copper Plant—Bowers
er, Company Will Exercise Options
On Pelican Point Lands.

It is not an unlikely thing that the Boston Consolidated Mining company, which has under consideration the erection of a large concentrating mill, will join the colony out near the point of the mountain this side of the old Garfield beach resort. During the recent visit of Daniel Guggenheim of the American Smelting and Refining company, several conferences were had with Samuel Newhouse, managing director of the Boston and such overtures were made and pressure brought to bear upon Mr. Newhouse that he has at least hinted in his plans to build reduction works for the Boston Con., ores in Utah county.

The chances are highly probable that the proposed plant, which will have initial capacity for the treatment of 2,300 tons per day, will come to Salt Lake county and that it will find a location near the American Smelting and Refining company's proposed copper plant and the Utah Copper company's concentrator.

There are a good many advantages to be gained by the Boston company going out to the point of mountain with the American and Utah Copper. In the first place, the expense of building a line of railroad from Bingham to the point of the mountain would be reduced, so that the company would effect a great saving in freight charges on concentrates, which would not be necessary, if the mill is built near the smelter, unless the company builds a plant of its own. Besides there are many other reasons why the point of mountain location would be preferable.

The Americans have the Bingham ore and it is most possible that it has in view the acquisition of a control of the property just as it had in the case of the Utah Copper the option on which is to be exercised in a few days.

It was learned from an authoritative source during the day that the Boston company would purchase the Utah county lands upon which it now holds options, even if the concentrator is not built there. The property is valuable and may become into good use later.
