

DIED.

At Rockport, Summit County, in this Territory, on Tuesday, October 6th, 1874, of inflammation of the kidneys, **EPHRAIM GREEN**.

Deceased was born March 5th, 1807, at the town of Rodman, Jefferson County, New York. He heard the gospel and was baptized in 1839. That he was permitted to hear its glorious principles and to bow in obedience to its requirements was a never-failing source of joy to him from the time of his baptism until his death, and as a consequence he never faltered, doubted or grew indifferent in relation to the great latter-day work. In the Summer of 1843 he went to Nauvoo, made the acquaintance of the Prophet Joseph and other leading men and returned to New York. In the Fall of 1845 he moved up with his effects to Nauvoo, left there with the first company for the western wilderness early in 1846, and stopped at Garden Grove. While at or near that point he learned of the demand of the Government for a battalion of five hundred men and enlisted. He marched through to California, received his discharge and was working at Sutter's grist mill when gold was discovered. He worked with his companions in the mines until 1848, when he came to this valley. He resided in this city until 1852, when he was called on a mission to the Sandwich Islands. He filled that mission faithfully and honorably, returned home and in May, 1855, was called to go again to the same Islands. From this latter mission he returned in August, 1858.

Brother Green was a man whom everybody who knew him intimately, loved—a generous, warm-hearted, true man, strong in his affections and friendships, and thoroughly devoted to his religion. It was ever his chief delight to converse upon its principles and to bear testimony to their truth. The arduous journey performed by him in the Battalion, his missions to the Islands, with the accompanying inconveniences and privations, he submitted cheerfully and without a murmur. The writer had opportunities of seeing him tested under circumstances of difficulty, and his conduct then, as always, was such as to give evidence that with him his religion was a practical reality, and that his aim was to be a Saint in very deed. His mission on earth is now ended, and he has gone to await the resurrection of the just; but the remembrance of his character and virtues will always be a bright spot in the memory of his friends.
