More About Bazaine. Paris, 11.-It is reported that Marshal Bazaine landed at San Reto, and traveled by way of Turin to Basie; at the latter place he took train to Brussels, where he arrived at 7 o'clock on Tuesday morning. It is believed that the rope found on the cliff on the Isle of St. Marguerite was suspended there to mis-lead the authorities as to the manner of the Marshal's escape, which was effected in some other way through the comivance of his guards. Lo Noir states that Bazaine had given his parole not to leave the island and that precautions were consequently relaxed and the sentry withdrawn from the Termes every morning at 5 o'clock, it being considered unnecessary to keep him there after daylight. Two soldiers belonging to the garrison swear that they saw the Marshal on the Terrace at 5:30 on Monday morn-

"The apartments occupied by Bazaine opened upon a terrace, which was built upon a ledge of a precipitous cliff overhanging the sea. A sentry was posted on the terrace, with orders to watch the

sea. A sentry was posted on the terrace, with orders to watch the prisoner's every movement. During Sunday evening the Marshal walked upon the terrace with Col. Villette, his aide de camp. At ten o'clock he retired as usual, apparently to sleep, but before daybreak he had effected his escape. He must have crossed the terrace in the dead of the night, and eluding the sentinel, gained the edge of the precipice, whence, by means of a knotted rope, he descended to the sea. He evidently slipped during the descent, and tore his hands, as the rope was found stained with blood in several places. Under the cliff, in a hired boat, were Bazaine's wife and cousin. They received him as he reached the water, and Madame is Marechal, taking the oars herself, rowed directly to the strange steamer which had been lying off the island since the previous evening. They reached the vessel in safety and were taken aboard, and the steamer then put to sea. It is thought they landed at Genoa, as the steamer proceeded in that direction. The first news of the affair came to Grasse, the hearest place on the coast, and the of the affair came to Grasse, the nearest place on the coast, and the magistrate immediately sent offi-cers in every direction to search for cers in every direction to search for the fugitives. There was great commotion in Marseilles when the facts became known, and an investigation was opened. Col. Villotte, who was walking with the Marshal on the evening of his escape, was discovered there, and imprisoned. The commandant of Fort St. Marguerite was placed under arrest, and Gen. Leval has gone to the island to investigate the affair.




