## EAGLES SOAR HIGH AT SALT PALACE

Excellent Program of Bicycle Races Arranged for Their Benefit.

### MOTORS CAUSE EXCITEMENT.

Another Record Smashed—Fourth in One Week—in the Five Mile Amateur Contest.

It was highly appropriate. It was Eagle's night at the Salt Palace, so was highly appropriate that a record should be clipped and that each race should be a fearful flight. The bicycle program turned out to be a winner—it was free from accidents despite the speed made in all heats; there was the hardest kind of footwork backed by the finest kind of headwork and it was all seen by the biggest crowd of the year. The crowd was on its feet almost constantly, either gasping or cheering. One race was started as soon after another had ended, so rapidly, keeping the interest at high tide. Held's band did its share towards making everyone happy by playing rag-time and popular airs.

### ANOTHER RECORD GOES.

The five-mile amateur race—another record—the fourth in week—smashed. There were races aplenty in the first. Twenty-three riders started and the track was completely covered for the first mile. Then they began dropping out, leaving the best to fight it out over the rest of the distance. In the third mile Crebs and Thomas took a break and tried to go around the bunch but the bunch got nervous and closed the distance. They steamed ahead and the distance was made resulting in pretty little contests. On the last lap Lawrence made a start and went ahead but he couldn't hold the lead. McCormick hopped up his buck and rode as if life depended upon it. Meyers tacked on second, Wright was third and Halstead a fourth. Time—10:31, two-tenths of a second lower than the amateur record made by Wilson in Ogden, 1905.

### EXCITING MOTOR RACE.

Samuelson, Turville and Whittier were the three motors entered in the open five-mile contest. Turville took the lead with Whittier riding slow on account of his machine acting unreliable, suddenly Samuelson shot ahead and after a neck-and-neck race passed Turville. The latter tacked on and it was a beautiful contest. Whittier kept kicking the engine into his machine and the two machines fairly jumped over the high places. Whittier passed Turville but Samuelson's machine was, by this time, spinning around the track so fast it looked like a streak in the lamp light. Samuelson lapped Turville with Whittier hanging on. Then Turville lapped the pair. They kept up the hard fight making the time for the five miles, 5:58:35.

### TWO-MILE LAP HANDICAP

saw some of the prettiest work of the season. Samuelson and McFarland were on the stretch with men strung all around the track. Turville was only a few yards behind the others. Downing picked up "Sam" and "Mac" and took the pair up to the middle. Then Samuelson spun and pulled "Mac" around through the bunch made the pair ride at the extreme upper edge of the track. Two laps from home "Mac" started his famous sprint and came in first although pushed to his fastest.

### WALKER WINS ONE.
