The monster cannon cast in the end of the sixteenth century by the Emperor Feodor Ivanovitch, which is one of the principal "lions" of the Kremlin, and has hitherto enjoyed the reputation of being the largest piece of artillery in Russia, has at length found a rival and superior in the colossal gun recently cast at Perm. This military Titan, according to the account of a correspondent of the St. Petersburg News, is fully two-thirds larger than its predecessor, and throws a ball weighing eighty Russian pounds, or 2,880 pounds. It is at present being tested by a commission of engineers, the Government having announced its intention, in case the report be favorable, of ordering five other pieces of similar calibre.

Mark Twain prospected for an interview with young Arthur Guelpin, when that royal young man was in Buffalo, but didn't get speech of him. In fact, as Mr. Twain says, "He made no remarks to us; did not ask us to dinner; walked right by us just as if he didn't see us; never inquired our opinion about any subject under the sun; and when his luncheon was over got into his carriage and drove off in the coolest way in the world, without ever saying a word—and yet he could not but know that that was the last time he might ever see us. Napoleon is said to be in a wretched state of health. His complexion has become livid, and he exhibits evidences of great debility. A correspondent of the New York Times says that the Prince Imperial is a clever and very frequently with his father, and that indications point to a speedy abdication in his behalf, with the Prince Napoleon as Regent. This, he says, would have been consummated long ago, were it not for the determined opposition of the Empress. She desires the Regency herself, but is too reactionary in her tendencies, and has too many sympathies with Rome, to satisfy the French people. Now that she is in Constantinople, it is thought the Emperor will carry out his wishes.

A friend of ours who resided some time in Havana, had, he tells us, a Chinese cook, and from his experience with this one, has conceived a high opinion of the Chinese in general. The cook was a complete servant; he not only prepared all his dishes in an admirable manner, learning most readily everything new, and improving on almost everything he learned, but his peculiar carefulness, delicacy, and cleanliness made everything specially appetizing. Besides doing the cooking, he officiated as dining-room servant, also swept the house, etc., and did the housework in general. He was peculiarly attentive to his employer's clothes, etc. When dinner was upon the table and announced, he was found at the head of the table, ready to wait upon the company, and no two or three waiters would have performed the duties thereof more satisfactorily. His peculiar trait seemed to be constant observation, and the facility to pick out excellence, and to adopt and practice them. To enable us to judge of his cleanliness, our friend told us that his Chinaman dressed always in white, down to his very slippers, and that he kept himself so clean that he never saw any dirt-stain upon his clothes. His cooking utensils after use were at once cleaned, and kept so clean, that it was stomach-assuring at all times to see him or his kitchen. Such is, at least, one Chinaman, as a cook and house-servant.—New Orleans Picayune.


