

## BALLOON RACE ACROSS NATION

Will Start from Los Angeles, and  
Terminate Where it  
Ends.

### SALT LAKE IS ON THE ROUTE

Contestant Wins Who Finds Best  
Currents to Carry Him Over Long-  
Distance, of Course.

The first balloon race ever held west of the Rockies is being planned by Los Angeles enthusiasts; it will be the greatest race ever planned in the United States, for that matter. A world's record will be gone after and the continent crossed—if all goes well. The "United States," the balloon with which Lieut. Lahm won the James Gordon-Bennett cup and the "American," which won second place in the international race at St. Louis, have been entered already. Both are now owned by Los Angeles balloonists. Dick Ferris owns the "United States." Col. L. M. Scott of Minneapolis really owns the "American," but negotiates the race between Col. Scott and Los Angeles parties and the transfer is certain. The race is expected to be started next month from Chutes park in Los Angeles.

Two routes have been discussed. One will take the balloonists due east from Los Angeles through Arizona, across a portion of Texas, then up through a long row of states up into eastern Canada. The other would also terminate in the region above the lakes, but would bring the contestants through this section of the country and over Salt Lake. The idea will be to go as far east or northeast as the winds and air currents will permit, the balloon covering the greatest distance to be declared the winner. Upon acquiring the "United States," Ferris issued a challenge to any balloonist, and now that other coast air-sailors have virtually landed the "American" the challenge has been accepted. The Aero club of California has accepted the honor of having the race in charge. Scientific data will be gathered, which will be of incalculable value to the United States meteorological department. Each balloon will carry, besides the experts in charge, an official of the Aero club, perhaps a government representative.

**ZEPHYRUS DISCUSSES RACE.**  
President Zerbe of the Aero club discusses the race in this strain: "Los Angeles is the one available point in the United States from which to initiate a long-distance flight."

"There is no place on the Atlantic coast which affords an opportunity of this character, as all the upper air currents have an easterly trend. In the northern hemisphere the trade winds all move to the east and north, hence the longest flights, which afford landing places within the United States, even though the starting places should be as far west as Omaha, would be less than 1,000 miles. Since the record made at St. Louis last October was 872 miles on the Atlantic coast, it is obvious that

for safety and assurance of distance the course must be initiated farther west.

"It is believed that the great trade wind which sweeps easterly from Los Angeles will afford a magnificent opportunity to make the record flight of the world. The range of mountains which rises abruptly from the plains, would be the direct agency to sweep the balloons upward into the great current, and, as shown by the observations and records of the weather bureau, the currents from the north from Salt Lake to Pike's Peak would effectually prevent a landing in the Rockies, thus assuring a flight toward Kansas city or St. Louis, and probably south of those points."

"San Francisco is too far north and in too close proximity to the Sierra Nevada range of mountains which stretches to the east and north over a course fully equal to 800 miles, and if a balloon should once clear the mountains it would undoubtedly find a resting place somewhere in western Canada."

## AUTO RACES AT THE STATE FAIR

Offer of Silver Loving Cup Trophy Brings Out String of  
Prospective Entries.

### UNDER AUSPICES OF CLUB

Local Good Roads Boosters Will Take  
Up the Event and Make  
It a Winner.

The invitation of the state fair management to the Salt Lake Automobile club to run races at the fair during the forenoon of Oct. 7, which has been set as Salt Lake day, has been accepted with acclamation by the Auto club. The board of directors met yesterday afternoon, and the matter went through with a whoop. The club is going to lose no time in planning the races. Everybody interested is, not only invited, but urged to attend another meeting scheduled for Monday evening when the program will be mapped out. The Automobile club's offices are in the Rocky Mountain Bell Telephone building, State street.

The races will be run on the horse track, and this will give the fair crowds the most thrilling of all. The automobile races have been seen in straight course runs and hill climbs, but the excitement in these is nothing compared to that created by fast races on a circular track. The skill and cool-headedness needed in races on a circular track make the constant struggle for position and place intensely interesting.

The directors of the club met at their club rooms today and were much pleased at the excellent headway made in the good road movement throughout the state.

### FINE AUTO RACES.

They are promising to put on at the state fair on Oct. 7, Salt Lake day, the finest automobile races seen in the country. Inquiries are coming in from all over the state, and the club promises to be kept. They are issuing a call to all automobile owners in the state to meet at the club rooms on Monday evening, Sept. 14, at 8 o'clock to arrange for the details of the races and the different events at which time they are desiring to enter may meet with the club.

### WILL TRY OUT ON TRACK.

The club is arranging with the fair association to secure the use of the tracks on certain days and to permit drivers to become familiar with the track and try out their machines. They will not be permitted to speed their machines on the streets, but will become a menace to the public, but any driver desiring to try his car on the track must do so as fast as he likes, but any one caught speeding on the roads will be arrested, and the club are petitioning the chief of police requesting him to refuse to set aside any street in town for practicing, as the track and hours arranged for will be ample for any one to thoroughly test out their machine before the races.

Merchants and prominent people throughout the state are coming forward with valuable cups as prizes as well as the fair association is offering a silver loving cup as a prize. The Automobile club association is one of the biggest days in the history of automobilism in the state.

### GOOD ROADS MOVE.

The Salt Lake Automobile club is waging a war of good roads. On every person who attended the Republican convention, the club is distributing buttons. The club is distributing these buttons at all conventions and primaries, and they promise to have every person who attended the convention on the good roads movement and auto boosting until such laws are enacted that will provide for proper highways. The club succeeded in having inserted in the Republican platform a good roads plank which reads as follows: "We favor the enactment of laws providing for a systematic construction of highways throughout the state, and for the adoption of prompt and vigorous methods of building good roads, by which the state and the various counties thereof shall co-operate to the very best advantage, and that a system of well constructed, substantial and well kept highways shall be made in every part of the state."

The Auto club has entered upon a campaign of good roads and is endeavoring to get all parties to insert planks in their platforms in favor of good roads. The Republican platform was the first to do so, and the club is going after the other conventions in like manner.

### AMERICA TO HAVE ONE BALLOON IN THIS RACE

New York, Sept. 17.—A. Holland Forbes, pilot, and Augustus Post, who will act as his aid, have shipped to Berlin Mr. Forbes' balloon, the Conqueror, and they will themselves sail in a few days to take part in the international balloon race to be started by Kaiser Wilhelm, from Berlin, on Oct. 1. The Conqueror is the only balloon made in America that will enter the contest, the other two pilots from this country having abandoned the purchase of foreign-made airships.
