AUERBACH MAKES BIG REALTY DEAL

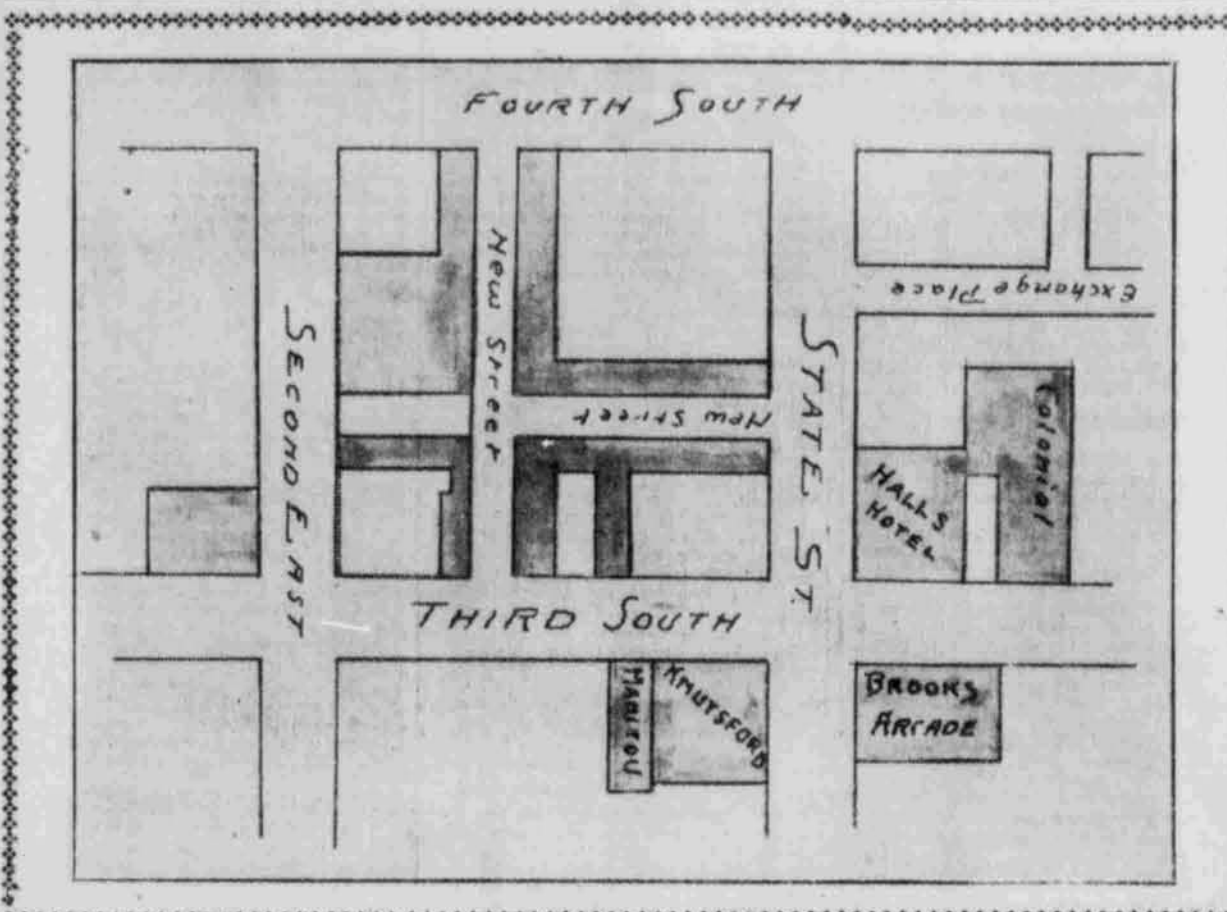
Choicest Pieces of State and Third South Become Property of New Yorker.

HOLDINGS THREE MILLIONS

Family Controls Sixteen Corners and Nearly a Mile of Business Frontage in Salt Lake.

Through a business deal which was closed Saturday afternoon and which gave to Samuel H. Auerbach of New York the choicest of the realty holdings in the neighborhood of State and Third South, it is a foregone conclusion that the shopping district of the city will follow the shadows which have been cast southward for several months, and that the invasion begun by Samuel Newhouse three years ago, is but a starter to what is to follow.

now approach \$3,000,000, but it is thought that in the last deal Mr. Auerbach has other New Yorkers interested with him.

On Saturday last the Auerbachs closed a deal which gave them broad options on the following properties: The Knutsford hotel corner, the Manitou hotel property, east of the Knutsford on Third South, in the block diagonally south of the Knutsford hotel, 23 1/2 feet on Third South street; 239 feet on Second East street; 13 1/2 feet on Fourth South, and 165 feet on State street.

In this block the Auerbachs already own realty facing on State five rods by 20 rods. They also possess the Brooks-Arcade property, on the northwest corner of Third South and State, and the Colonial theater and Touraine building on Third South.

The disposition of the Knutsford hotel is problematical. The lease on the property, owned by G. S. Holmes, runs until 1912, and Mr. Holmes says that he has made no change in his plans which would involve his disposing of the lease.

CUT STREETS THROUGH. CITY streets are to be cut through the block to the south of the Knutsford and it is probable that building operations on a plane with those going on to the west of this site, the new Commercial club and others, will be commenced in the spring. These streets are to be 65 feet in width, one running the entire distance through the block from Third South to Fourth South, and the other running east and west from the intersection to State street.

The Halla hotel corner, which is held by the Auerbachs on a 50-year lease, is to be the site for the new department store, one of the largest in the entire west. This will be run in conjunction with the present uptown store. The plans are already in the hands of a New York architect and the active operations will be started as soon as the building season of the spring arrives.

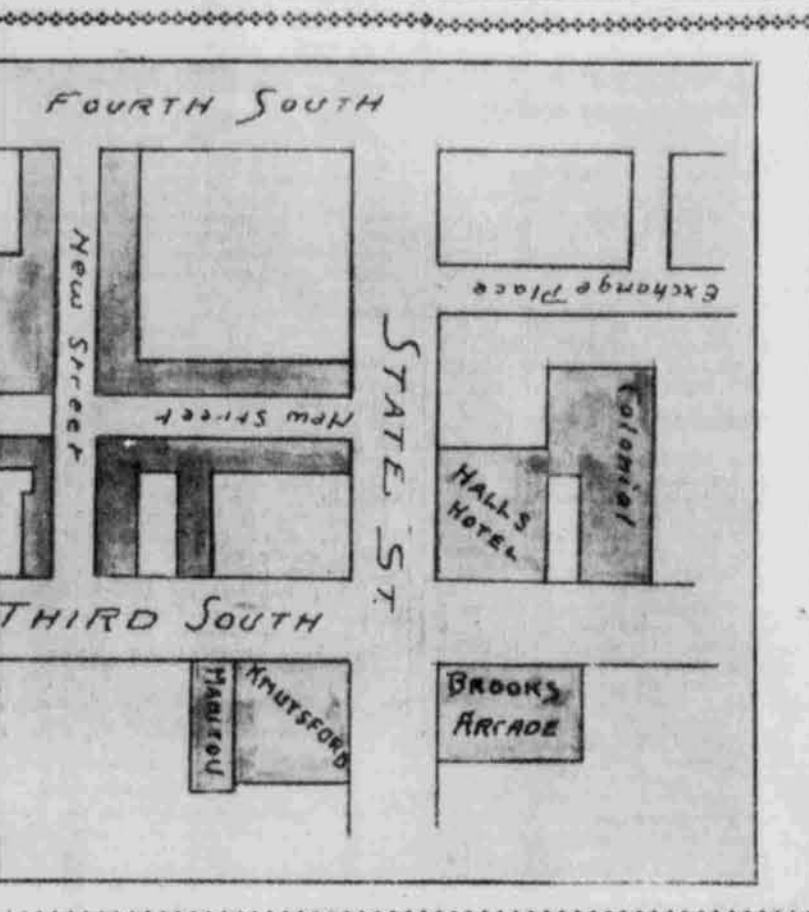
