George Story About the Initial Appearance of His Lawyer.

THE DIVORCE PROCEEDINGS.

A Story to the Effect that Pitzel, Supposed to Have Been Murdered, is Still Alive.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 18.—A strange story is whispered about Shoenauer's initial appearance in this case. A year ago, it is said, he first came to Philadelphia. Whence he has been seen to know, but it is the effect that he had ten hours in a little town in Indiana. Upon his arrival here he is said to have given the receipt of a letter to Hodges signed "H."
