SEARCHING FOR TWO WHITES IN ARCTIC REGIONS

New York, June 29 .- In a letter to the American museum of natural history, V. Stefanzson, leader of the party which V. Stefanzson, leader of the party which the museum sent out a year and a half ago to explore the Arctic region, tells of this remarkable quest for a "white man and woman with fair hair," who are understood to be living among the Eskimos, 800 or 900 miles east of Col-ville, near the mouth of Coppermine river. Dr. Stefanzson states that he believes this white, man and woman have been members of either Franklin's lost expedition in that neighborhood, or have been members of either Franklin's lost expedition in that neighborhood, or of one of the lost Icelandic colonies of Greenland. He wrote that never before had a man and a woman of the Cau-casian race caused such comment among the Eskimos who in that vicin-ity had never seen white human be-ings and who are believed to be some-thing on the order of deities.
