

SENATE COUNTS ON A BUSY WEEK

Consideration of Panama Canal Bill Will be a Chief Feature.

PRESS APPROPRIATION BILLS.

Naming of Rate Bill Conference and Barnes Case Waiting on Tillman's Return.

Washington, May 27.—The senate is counting on a busy week, and the prospect is favorable to long workdays and few interruptions. After Monday there will be at least two appropriation bills ready for consideration, and the sea-level canal bill, having been made the unfinished business, will be pressed as steadily as circumstances will permit. In addition, conference will be appointed on the railroad rate bill; that many Senate of Washington will receive attention, and the bill declaring a policy in the matter of the purchase of Panama canal surplus will be considered.

The senate manifests a disposition to devote serious consideration to the canal type bill. When it is taken up, Senator Kitteredge will present in a speech of considerable length the reasons which compelled the majority of the committee on interoceanic canals to report in favor of the sea-level plan. It is now expected that he will speak Monday, and it is understood that his address will be the first of a series on the subject. On Tuesday Senator Milard, chairman of the canal committee, will present a report giving the views of the minority members in favor of a lock canal.

The general plan is to press the consideration of the appropriation bills as speedily as possible. The postoffice and naval bills will be ready for consideration early in the week, but it is expected that they will be given reference. Both will present features that will arouse debate, and it is a foregone conclusion that special attention will be given to the provision in the naval bill for a new monster warship.

Conference reports on the agricultural and legislative appropriation bills will probably be made before the close of the week, and it is expected that the report of the conferees on the Indian bill, which already has been presented, will be taken up early Monday.

Two matters have been waiting somewhat on the return of Senator Tillman from South Carolina. These are the appointment of conferees on the rate bill and the further consideration of the Barnes nomination. Mr. Tillman is expected to be in his seat Monday. The rate bill conferees, of whom the South Carolina senator will be one, will be named then, and it is expected that the conference will begin as soon as Mr. Tillman can conclude his work in connection with the Barnes case.

The canal supply bill will be debated at some length, and Senator Rayner will be among those to be heard on that measure.

Work on the sundry civil appropriation bill will begin in the house this week. This bill is larger and carries more money than any preceding sundry civil act. The aggregate will be in the neighborhood of \$90,000,000. There will be a great demand on the part of members to make speeches relating to items affecting their particular home districts, and Chairman Tamm expects that it will require fully a week to consider and pass the bill.

It is planned that no adjournment will be taken for the observation of Decoration day Wednesday.

The Democratic filibuster to emphasize to the country that no progress is apparent on the statehood agreement is continuing, considerable time in the house. All calls to determine the presence of a quorum have begun each day's session, with few exceptions, and Minority Leader Williams announces his intention, encouraged by a "round robin" from his colleagues, to continue these methods. The statehood conferees announce that an agreement on that measure is in sight and may be reported during the week.

LTS. WEST AND REMINGTON SAY DATTO ALI IS DEAD

San Francisco, May 27.—Concerning the report that Datto Ali, the Burmese rebel chief, is still alive, Lieut. S. B. West and Philip Remington today made statements. Both officers are with the twenty-second infantry, and were with Capt. McCoy in his march into Mandalay and against Ali. They say that every man in Ali's stronghold was killed with the exception of a Moro boy, who escaped. Ali's body was found in front of his house with a bullet wound. Dr. Davis, the army surgeon, with the expedition, examined the body and pronounced Ali dead. The body was identified as that of the Moro chief by two faithful guides, who knew him well. One of them was a half-breed of the name Datto Enok. Sergeant Lewis A. Carr, company K, twenty-second infantry, also recognized the body as that of Datto Ali. He knew him in 1901 and 1902. Lieut. West says that Ali was the last of a long line of rebels and exerted powerful influence over the Moros. When it became known throughout the island that he had been killed, the result almost immediately was that the Moros were quieted. Lieut. West thinks the report that Ali is alive was circulated by the Sultan of Ganassi for the purpose of trying to secure the prestige held by Ali.

PROTECTION FOR FOREIGNERS.

Paris, May 27.—A semi-official note issued today relative to reports of trouble at Point-a-Pitre, Guadeloupe and Fort de France, Martinique says there is no possibility of danger to foreigners there, who are protected by a garrison of 500 men and two warships.

AUSTRIAN TARIFF DIFFICULTY.

Vienna, May 27.—Emperor Francis Joseph's expected return to Vienna later this week appears to have resulted in a settlement of the tariff difficulty. A conference of the Emperor, Prince von Hohenlohe-Schillingfuerst, Austrian premier and minister of the interior, and Dr. Wackerle, the Hungarian premier, this morning, was followed by a council, at which the emperor presided. This afternoon, after which Premier Wackerle stated that the question of a common Austro-Hungarian customs tariff had been settled yesterday in a manner that was expected to satisfy both countries.

HEAVY RAIN IN SAN FRANCISCO.

San Francisco, May 27.—A heavy rain storm swept over this city and surrounding country last night and today, damaging fruit gardens, flooding basements and bringing much discomfort and misery to the refugees camped out on low ground.

One and fifteen hundredths of an inch of rain fell, which is the heaviest rainfall for this late season of the year since 1884.

The storm added such hardships to refugees and caused much annoyance to those sheltered in houses but who are still compelled to cook outdoors. In several parts of the city refugees camped in low places were driven out of their tents by the rush of water. Several stores on Fillmore street, which was impassable between Post and Eddy streets for a time, were flooded and many cellars inundated.

BOMBS THROWN.

During Review of Troops at Sebastopol, Killing Three.

Sebastopol, May 27.—Several bombs were thrown here today while a review of troops was being held after the triumph in celebration of the anniversary of the emperor's coronation.

Three persons were killed and several others wounded. Among the wounded was the commander of the fortress, Gen. Nepueff, who received slight hurts, and the chief of police, who was gravely injured. Other high dignitaries escaped. Vice Admiral Choukine, commanding the Black sea fleet, who is a special subject for terrorist revenge, was not present. Two of the bombthrowers were arrested.

TWO SUNDAYS ENOUGH.

Kokomo, Ind., May 27.—Two Puritanical Sundays were enough for Kokomo. This morning every drug store, restaurant, ice cream booth, news stand and cigar shop was opened for business and remained open all day. Constable Wooty arrested 14 shopkeepers, each giving bond and releasing them. The Sunday closing ordinance is backed by the nation which were closed several weeks ago.

A RIOT IN SEATTLE.

Eleven Battered Men in Jail and Several Patrolmen Nursing Injuries.

Seattle, May 27.—Eleven bruised and battered men are in jail, several patrolmen are nursing minor injuries, and extra officers are on duty in the vicinity of Second avenue and Washington street, as the result of a small sized riot, which was precipitated early this evening, when a city policeman attempted to apprehend an escaped prisoner at the county jail. A large crowd had gathered on Washington street to listen to the customary lecture given by Socialist and religious meetings that are held on the curb. A woman evangelist was preaching to the crowd when Lieut. Riley, an escaped trusty from the city jail, interrupted her. Patrolman W. C. Hubbard recognized the man and placed him under arrest. Riley resisted and fought the officer as he was being taken to the patrol box. The patrolman fought so desperately that the patrolman was obliged to knock him down and handcuff him.

A crowd from a Socialist gathering nearby immediately gathered in the street with cries of "Kill the cop," "beat him up," and "go for him." Hubbard was kicked and beaten, but managed to hang on to his prisoner until the patrol wagon arrived. When Lieut. Corning jumped from the wagon he was also attacked, and it was with difficulty that Riley was taken to headquarters.

Two other patrolmen, attracted to the scene, found the crowd back and arrested Hugo Shea, Edw. Baker and Robert Johnson.

When Patrolman Hubbard returned to his beat from the police station, he was again set upon, and Chief of Police Wapenstein sent out a detail of 20 patrolmen and detectives from the night squad that was just going on duty to quell the disturbance.

With handiwork as weapons, the officers soon dispelled the mob and arrested several more of the rioters, after knocking several men down. Phil Riley, Hugo Shea, Edward Baker, Robert Johnson, G. T. Anderson, M. Albion, Gust Swenson, Dick Pratley, Frank Brown, C. E. Carleton and S. E. Egan.

Miss Mary Risney and Samuel Goldstein, who were also in the boat were released. Rocking the boat caused it to capsize.

DR. DARWIN D. EADS DEAD.

Chicago, May 28.—Dr. Darwin D. Eads, lately of Paris, Ky., where he had practiced medicine for 40 years, died here yesterday at the residence of his son, B. B. Eads. Dr. Eads was a botanist of wide reputation and his contributions to the botanical collection at the Smithsonian Institution included almost all of the flora of the central states. He was a member of many medical associations.

CHINESE GIRLS.

Being Smuggled Eastward to Escape Deportation.

Chicago, May 28.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Philadelphia says:

Chinese girls, forced by the San Francisco earthquake from the underground dens that held them captive, are being smuggled eastward to escape deportation, according to information received by the police yesterday. The department has been informed that several scores of them are on their way hither. Five have arrived and disappeared. Detectives of both Philadelphia and New York are watching for the slaves.

ULTIMATUM IGNORED.

New York, May 28.—An ultimatum from the general arbitration board of the Building Trades Employers' association, calling on the brotherhood of painters to declare official the strike against the Master Painters' association, pending arbitration, the decision of the Charles Stewart Smith, has been ignored by the painters. Their delegates announced yesterday that their brotherhood would have nothing to do with the general arbitration board. This is equivalent to throwing aside the general arbitration plan.

About 1,500 men are on strike against the two associations of painters, and they are all very large firms, and the strike has stopped painting and decorative work on many large buildings.

Morgue, Pa., May 27.—Nine men were burned, two of them seriously, in a gas explosion in the mine of the Brazell Gas Coal company, near Bentley, Pa. last night. The men were erecting a fire wall to stop a fire that had started from an unusually heavy blast.

San Francisco, May 28.—Lieut. Col. Geo. H. Torney, deputy surgeon general, has been relieved as chief military inspector of the refugee camps about the city and returned to duty as commander of the general hospital at the Presidio.
