Sentenced for Seven Years. CINCINNATI, March 31. - B njamin E. Hopkins, late assistant cashier of the Fidelity National Bank, who has been in jail two months awaiting sen. tence under conviction for viola-tion of the national bank-iog law, was brought into the United States court this morning, upon the motion of District Attorney Burnett and was sentenced to the contration for size of the penitentiary for seven years and two months. He appeared broken down from lilness, but did not manifest deep emotion upon receiving the sentence.
