

After thawing out at Elder Snow's residence, and refreshing himself, the Dr. sallied forth on Saturday and called, as is his custom, upon "the Bishops and Elders" of the different elements in our community. He arranged to meet the people and to speak to them in reference to organizing the Bible Society's work in this valley. Saturday evening, on invitation, the Doctor lectured to a large meeting of young people in Council Hall. Sabbath morning, with the approbation of the superintendents, he addressed the two Ward Sunday Schools; then at 11 o'clock he spoke to the people assembled in the Tabernacle, explaining the objects and methods of the American Bible Society. At 3 p.m. he spoke to the Presbyterian S. S., and at 4 p.m. addressed a meeting and organized a full grown auxiliary Bible Society, in Council Hall. Bishops Maiben and Jensen, Rev. Martin, Superintendents Bybee, Bench and others participating.

In view of our inability, for lack of funds, to make a thorough canvass of the field, it was unanimously resolved "that we request the district superintendent to send a colporteur as early as possible to make such canvass, and we will facilitate the work in our midst as far as practicable."

The Society here now numbers more than 25, and its interests are cared for by an active and competent executive committee.

In the evening the Dr. preached in Fox's Hall to an appreciative audience, a sermon full of instruction and encouragement, on the reliability and adaptation of the Bible to meet the wants of the immortal soul. Thus six important meetings were held almost within twenty-four hours.

Dr. Fisher was most cordially received by all friends of the Bible, in the varied religious elements of the community, and left Manti with the hearty God speed of all who came into contact with him publicly or socially.

At Ephraim, on Tuesday evening, President Canute Petersen opened the tabernacle and presided at a large gathering of people, who listened with wrapt attention to the Doctor's fervid eloquence in behalf of the Bible cause.

President Petersen gave the movement his hearty endorsement, and a society of 60 members was organized, with a correspondingly large amount of money contributed, to apply the depository with the Word of Life.

The same resolution relative to sending in a colporteur was passed that was passed by the Manti Society.

Thus, within three days, the Dr. organized two strong societies, and went on his way rejoicing, carrying letters of introduction and commendation to the Bishops of Mount Pleasant from President Petersen. All who heard the Doctor will look with pleasure for his early return to Sanpete.
