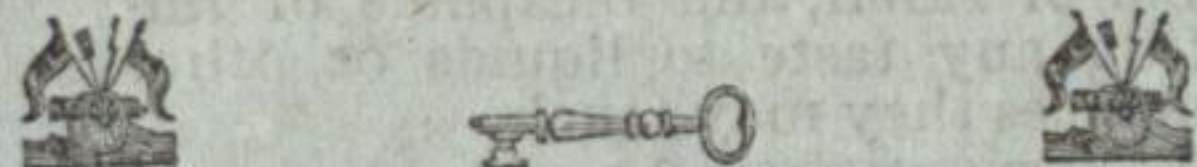


**Died.**
