"THE FIRST ACTRESS ON THE AMERICAN STAGE."—The Golden Era of May 18th has the following concerning that eminent actress, Mrs. D. P. Bowers—
Mrs. Bowers closed a five weeks' engagement last night to a crowded house. The success of this eminent artist has been pronounced on this her third engagement on this coast as on either of her previous visits. The treasurer gives a very satisfactory account of the receipts, and visitors can see for themselves that her audiences have been drawn from the best circles in the city. The last week opened with "East Lynne" with Mr. Chaplin as Carlyle. Tuesday, the romantic play of "Camille" was given with Mr. McCullom as Armand. These are not plays in which Mrs. Bowers appears to the best advantage but her name was sufficient to fill the house on each occasion. Wednesday night Sheridan Knowles' play of "The Wife, a Tale of Mantua," was produced with Mrs. Bowers as Mariana and Mr. McCullough as Julian St. Pierre. These are the two strong characters in the play, and we venture to say they have seldom fallen into abler hands. Mrs. Bowers' remarkable dramatic power finds scope for action in this character. Never was a woman sterner in her vindication of her honor to her enemies, or more winning and womanly in her pleadings to those she believes inclined to do her justice. The transition from supplication to defiance worked such a change in her countenance and in her bearing that if one lost sight of her for a second he would almost believe that two persons were enacting one part—one all gentleness and persuasion, the other impatient, scornful and defiant. It was a great exhibition of dramatic power, and an additional evidence of the genius and versatility of the distinguished artist.
