THE MORMON QUESTION AGAIN.

We are more than ever convinced that Judge McKean, who occupies the place of one whose business it is to administer law according to its true intent, is as confirmed a bigot as any Mormon he desires to persecute; that he is utterly wanting in sagacity or knowledge of law; that his purpose is to complicate difficulties where none need to exist; and that he ought to be driven ignominiously from the bench. His whole course as Judge, since the prosecution of the leading Mormons began, has been that of a narrow-minded zealot, as ignorant of law as he is reckless of the consequences of his extrajudicial acts. He started out, not to investigate, but to convict. All his utterances and his whole conduct have shown the animus of the man from first to last. He exhibits the worst qualities of a fanatic, and it is almost safe to say. from his doings, that he is a religious bigot of some sort, and is better fitted to perform the part of a wandering dervish than to sit in judgment where the liberty of one of an opposing creed

What is it that this man and his confederates propose to do?
