That the building of the Ogden smel-ter by the Utah Smelting company, comprised principally of prominent Og-den business men, is a sure go, was verified in this city today by Charles W. Nibley, one of the directors of the new company, and Belah Kadish, the chief engineer. The articles of incor-poration of the company were filed yes-terday at Ogden and the document will terday at Ogden and the document will probably reach the office of Secretary of State Tingey sometime during the

day. The decision to locate the plant at Bonneville, a short distance north of Ogden Hot Springs, was arrived at after careful consideration. The site is so far removed from the rich culti-vated sections of Weber and Boxeider counties that the possibility of damage from poisonous fumes is remote. Mr. Nibly says the work of construc-tion is to be pushed rapidly and the first unit of the plant will be ready for operation just as early as possible. That the plant will be of immense benefit to the people of Ogden and vicinity, there is not the slightest doubt. It will stimulate interest in the mining

district north of here and it is sup-posed to get a share of the ores com-ing from the camps of Nevada, Idaho and Wyoming.

WESTERN MARKET LETTER.

Special Correspondence. Stock Yards, Kansas City., Mo., Monday, Jan. 1.-The cottle supply last week was only hult as large as the previous week, at 21,000 head, hut was about the usual holiday run. Mar-ket was satisfactory on all kinds ex-cept fed steers, which lost 10 to 20 conts during the week. They have regained all of this today, some sales being 15 to 25 cents higher today than last Fitday. Cows and butcher stuff advanced 10 to 15 cents last week, and this class is strong to 10 higher today. Stockers and feeders were quiet last week, but had a firm underione, mar-ket strong to 10 higher today. The year 1965 was a successful one for cattle marketed being \$20 per head, \$3 per head more than during 1904. Colorado marketed 75,000 cattle at Kansas City, an increase of 45 per cent over the previous year. Receipts from the panhandle country and New Mexico were about normal. Arizona shows an increase. Utab and Idaho and the far western country also a large increase, as a good many ship-ments came here last year that ordi-nardly would be sent to California.
