1832.

Died 22. LORENZO D. BARNES, at Redland, England.

1833.

Nov. 5. KNOWLES P. HANER, of Narbonne, on the River Orbiel, on the way to the Indies. Buried at sea, age 21, 54 ft., and longitude 26.11 west of Greenwich.

1834.

April 26. MERTHIN-SHEPHERD SELLING, of consumption, on the steamer Niagara, near the mouth of the Ohio River, on his way to St. Louis, Mo.

1835.

May 5. EDWARD MALIN, of Winter Quarters, of cholera at St. Louis, returning from Pennsylvania.

1836.

Jan. 29. JAMES HENRY FLANDOR, of Winter Quarters, of smallpox, at Birmingham, England.

March 17. WILLIAM BURTON, of Salt Lake City, of bilious or chill fever, at Edinburgh, Scotland.

1837.

Aug. 21. WILLARD SNOW, of Salt Lake City, on the steamer Franklin, the German Ocean, coming from Copenhagen to England. Buried at sea.

Aug. 25. JOHN HYDE, at Sydney, Australia.

1838.

Oct. 2. W. W. MARSH, of Salt Lake City.

1839.

May 15. ALFRED CHAMBERLAIN, of Alcheson, Kansas, returning from a mission to the States.

June 13. ANDREW L. LAMOURAIS, of Salt Lake City, at St. Louis, Mo., returning from France.

July 1. ROBERT F. KEELEY, of Rock Creek, was of Fort Kearney, Neb., returning from Europe.

Aug. 16. JANE AMASIA STEVENS LEWIS, of Salt Lake City, of consumption, in the mountains, twelve miles from the town of Keweenaw, from the San Juan Islands. Buried at San Bernardino by the side of her year old son, William Henry, who died at Los Angeles, June 20, 1851, when his parents were on their way to California.

Nov. 28. GEORGE PRICE WADDEY, of or near the head of Emigration canyon, returning from Great Britain, in Captain Edward Martin's steamer company.

May 18. PARLEY P. PRATT, of Salt Lake City, assassinated by Hester H. McLean, near Van Buren, Arkansas.

May 12. SAMUEL FRANCIS NEELSON, of Salt Lake City, in Williamson, N. Y., of consumption, returning from England. Buried in Cypress Hill Cemetery.

Nov. 2. GEORGE A. SMITH, JR., of Salt Lake City, killed by Navajo Indians in New Mexico.

April 27. HIRAM KIMBALL, and THOMAS ATKINS, of the steamship Empress of Asia, San Pedro, Cal., while going to the Sandwich Islands.

Sept. 20. JOHN MICHENER KAY, of Salt Lake City, of inflammatory rheumatism, near Little Laramie, returning from England.

Sept. 21. EDWARD HINCHINBROOK, of American Fork, Utah county, at Bear River, from effects of a cold, on returning from the States.
