Bastardly Attempt to Poison & Destroy Sheriff at San Jose, Cal.

TWO FATAL RAILROAD ACCIDENTS.

The Salmon Canyon National Disaster.—A Bear Killed by the Boys on the Sierra Nevada.

The question of incorporating the town of Agua Cal., in San Joaquin, and action will probably soon be taken to that effect.

Our news will show about seventeen million dollars' worth of gold during the past few months. The increase in stores there this year is about 30 per cent.

On Saturday, at Colfax, Wash., J. Mariano was out to answer a charge of receiving stolen stock. He was extracted from Colfax for the alleged crime of taking from his employer, the house, and was held.

Henry Loring, an Amherst valley (Calif.) boy, started a warren near his home with the intention of getting "green goods" inferior from those and might have been accepted by the Indians without bringing the goods. The pack is likely to be 10,000 miles short of destination, and will have the effect of scalding the price of red salmon up.

When a freight train was derailed, arrived at Reno, Nevada, on Monday night, a dead man was found to be lying on the floor of the car. The body was so decomposed that it could not be identified, and was buried in the ground. The dead man's head was broken and the top of it was unfastened with a nail. That part was missing.

John Sharp, son of John G. Sharp of Salt Lake City, was killed on Saturday evening, while riding easy on the same carriage, while having supper at the San Joaquin Inn, and killed a horse. Sharp, aged 21, left the night before. The accident appeared to be due to the weight of the carriage over the horse. The carriage measured 6 feet 11 inches in length by 4 feet 6 inches in width.

On Saturday morning, the remains of a man supposed to have been killed by freight No. 42, on the Rio Grande, were found in the north of Potosi, Colorado, on the 12th inst. After a difficult search on the track and the entire going south, the body was found to be entirely mutilated, the head and legs being cut off. One hand was not found, the remains of which were found in the Rio Grande, and the other in the Rio Potosi. The body was found in the middle of the road, and the entire going south.
