He sought for the owner and finding one, gave him notice that Mrs. McCormick had used the flour and her entire family was ill. The boy died and another is expected to follow. The other members of the family will recover. The examination showed that poison was mixed with the flour. The author of the poison is unknown. The flour and coffee were imported for Shaffer's family and are looking for the unknown among those known to be in camp with the farmer.

Army Regulations Amended.

The Railroad Telegraphers.

NEW YORK, June 18.—The grand division of the Order of the Railway Telegraphers has decided to purchase the telegraph rights of the railroad way between New York and Boston. The railway telegraphers, on the other hand, have struck a slogan in their negotiations, looking to amalgamation with the telegraphers of the railway, which provides that no operator must have done railroad telegraphing three months ago to become a member. The telegraphers have agreed to give out for one year's qualification. They say that the three years limit would be out fully thirty per cent of the men in the railroad. Another conference between the two associations will be held.
