

WM. HYDE DEAD.

A Former Well Known Salt Lake Pioneer Aways.

News has reached this city of the death of William Hyde, at Macon, California, at 11:15 a.m., Thursday, Sept. 14. The immediate cause of death was Bright's disease.

Mr. Hyde was well known throughout Utah. He was one of the early settlers and for a number of years was a prominent citizen of Salt Lake City, and a city official. He went west in 1850, where he has remained. He never married and was a member of children in southern and southwestern Utah, and in southern Colorado. He would have been 60 years of age had he lived until the 25th of this month.

FIRST OF THE YEAR.
