In my travels through Utah Co., from which I have just returned, I am pleased to notice that, almost universally, the crops are looking unusually well. The building spirit is quite general. I scarcely recognized the city of Provo, the improvements of the last ten years have so materially changed the outlook for the better, and the same spirit is noticeable toroughout the county generally. 
