CACHE VALLEY PIONEER DAY

Logan Celebrates Advent of First Party of Settlers Fifty Years Ago.

BIG PARADE THIS MORNING.

Monument Dedicated—Jas. A. Langton, Secretary and Manager of the Boosters' Club, Orator of Day.

(Special to the "News.")

Logan, May 6.—Fifty years ago today the first party of settlers entered Cache Valley and pitched their tents on the spot now occupied by the city of Logan. Today the citizens of Logan, 12,900 strong, are devoting the day to honoring the memory of the hardy band of six who first set their homesteads on the site of the now beautiful and prosperous city, the pride of Cache Valley and the "Athens of the North."

Among the features of today's celebration is the unveiling of a monument, consisting of a rough-hewn shaft on a heavy pedestal, bearing a bronze plate inscribed with the following legend: "Set far from this spot, on the bank of the Little Logan, camped early in May, 1859, these first settlers in Logan: Griffith Childs, Abraham Caldwell, Sidney Dibble and wife, and David Reese and wife. Their memory is honored by the unveiling of this monument, erected by the citizens of Logan, May 6, 1909."

A monument stands near the northeast corner of the Tabernacle square in the center of the city. It is composed of native stone quarried in Logan canyon and is known as Conglomerate, a combination of quartzite and sandstone. The monument and bronze tablet were designed by Jacob Schaub, of this city.

James A. Langton, secretary and manager of the Boosters' club, under whose auspices the celebration is given, was the orator at the unveiling ceremony. Other suitable exercises were given, consisting of musical numbers, etc.

PARADE THIS MORNING.

The program for the celebration included a parade in honor of the pioneers. The procession formed at the courthouse at 9:30 a. m. Capt. Perry, of the United States army, military instructor at the agricultural college, is marshal of the day, and the U. S. C. brass band and cadets are prominent features of the procession. Following the band came the 50 pioneers, in automobiles. These were followed by a band of Washakie Indians, next in line came handcarriers and ox teams, presenting a striking contrast with the shining vehicles of modern manufactures occupying the parade. The parade was followed by the Young College band and student body made an imposing appearance in line, followed by prominent citizens in carriages.

All business houses in the city closed at 9:30 o'clock this morning in honor of the pioneers, and the streets were thronged with people from this city and many of the neighboring towns of the country. Visitors from Salt Lake and Ogden and other places were also among the crowd.

After the parade, which was a mile in length, luncheon was served at noon at the hotel. There was a general promenade on the shady sides of the streets and the crowd began to drift to the ball grounds where a battle royal on the diamond is scheduled between a nine comprised of Washakie Indians and the team representing the Boosters' club. A program of athletic sports is also one of the features this afternoon, the day's celebration terminating with a grand ball tonight.
