BY TELEGRAPH.

WASHINGTON, 13.—Malone, from the committee on agriculture, reported to the House a bill to establish a bureau of animal industry, and to prevent the exportation of diseased cattle and the spread of infectious and contagious diseases among domestic animals.

The House joint resolution appropriating \$50,000 for the fishing expedition in London was passed.

WASHINGTON, 13.—The House went into committee of the whole on the sundry civil bill.

Henderson offered an amendment appropriating \$4,000 for the widow and children of his late colleague, Hawk; agreed to.

The next item was to pay the contestants and contestants for seats in the House various sums, aggregating about \$70,000; which was agreed to.

Hickock offered an amendment appropriating \$20,000 for salaries and expenses of the commission to negotiate a commercial treaty with Mexico; adopted.

Blackburn, of Kentucky, offered an amendment appropriating the amount necessary to pay Cannon, of Utah, balance of salary and mileage due him when the contest was ended; agreed to.

Ryan offered an amendment limiting the expenses of two or more than agents, that have been or may be consolidated into one to \$15,000; agreed to.

Holmes, of Indiana, offered an amendment appropriating \$15,000 to enable the President to carry out the statute to promote civil service reforms and official accountability. After a long political discussion it was adopted.

The committee then rose and the bill and amendments were reported to the House. All the amendments were concurred in. The bill then passed, yeas 139, nays 49. The Senate amendment to the deficiency appropriation bill will be concurred in. Adjourned.

AMERICAN.

WASHINGTON, 13.—The following army order has been issued to-day: By the direction of the President the Military Department at West Point is to be discontinued August 20th, 1893; by the direction of the President, sections 1 and 2 of the general regulations for the United States Military Academy, are hereby amended to read as follows: To the General of the Army:

Under your department you shall have the supervision and charge of the United States Military Academy, and shall watch over the discipline and instruction of the corps of cadets, and you will make reports thereof to the Secretary of War. The Superintendent, in his absence, next in rank, shall have immediate command of the Academy, and shall be commander of the military part of the Academy.

Col. Wesley Merritt, of the Fifth United States Cavalry, is appointed Superintendent of the Military Academy at West Point, and will relieve Brigadier General Howard. General Howard is assigned to the command of the Department of Arizona, in place of Brigadier General Orlando B. Willcutt. Colonel Willcutt, and his regiment, of the Twelfth Infantry, go to the Department of the Pacific.

Storm Signals.

The War Department is preparing to begin the proposed new system of giving the alarm of an approaching storm by the firing of cannon at the towers reached by telegraph. The experiment is to be tried here and if found successful, it is expected that it will prove a great benefit to agricultural districts.

Fast Postal Cars Flying Across the Continent—Chicago Left Out in the Cold.

The pool lines have lost to Chicago the fast mail from New York to San Francisco, and it remains to be seen whether they will in consequence lose some through traffic. There is to be a fast mail from New York to San Francisco, the first train having started yesterday. The line runs from New York to Chicago, and the Baltimore and Ohio; the latter is Chicago, and the pool lines. The Helicon went in at 6 o'clock in the evening bearing the notice that any application for troops must be made by a steamer, to be sent out to the fleet.

Disappointed.

The Herald's telegram, dated on board the United States ship Quaker, says everybody on the American ship is much disappointed at the decision of the English ships yesterday. They say that a steamer would have done the work in half the time.

Council of War.

This afternoon a grand council was held of all the former ministers, at a certain place to deliberate on the dispatch of Turkish troops to Egypt.

The Khedive is said to be at Ramleh surrounded by Egyptian troops. The position is thought to be critical.

The fire in Alexandria is greatly extended in the direction of the port.

The British gunboat Blithers is cruising off Rembah Palace.

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

The President has approved the enabling national banking act, so enabling the national banks to extend their corporate limits.

Engineer McKean testified that Long got the signals for the management of the boat all mixed up and gave him wrong ones.

Captain Young, of the steamer Kops, telegraphed yesterday from Honolulu, 60 miles off Hawaii, as follows: I am just starting for Nova Zembla with a schooner in tow which I intend leaving to cruise on the west coast of Nova Zembla and pick up any of the crew of the Bria that may have drifted across the ice.
