GOLDFIELD LABOR DIFFICULTIES SETTLED.

Goldfield, Sept. 14.—The labor diffi-culty at Goldfield is settled. The mines which have been idle for sevmines which have been tole for sev-eral days will resume operations in the morning. At 5:30 o'clock this evening the tooting of an automobile in Goldfield announced the return of the joint committee of the mine owners and union miners which had been at Teraneah sizes waterday aftermoon hi Tonopah since yesterday afternoon. was not long before the automobile was surrounded by hundreds of anxlous citizens and miners eager for any news that might be given out. George Wingfield gave the word to the citizens crowded around him that the troublea had been adjusted and President Clough announced to the miners that Clough announced to the miners that they were to prepare for work at once as the mines would be open and ready for their old corps of miners for the morning shift. A cheer went up that was almost deafening, and it was taken up block by block until it reached from one end of the town to the other. WOULD-BE TRAIN **ROBBERS DRIVEN OFF.**

Peoria, III., Sept. 14.—Four masked men attempted to hold up passenger train No. 311 on the Rock Island one and a half miles north of Peoris to-night at 10 o'clock, and but for the presence of mind of Conductor Mur-ray, who disarmed one of the men af-ter being struck on the head the second ter being struck on the head, the pas-sengers would have been robbed. There were about 100 persons on the train, which left Chicago at 6 o'clock. Sheriff Potter and a force of deputies and Peoria police are searching the woods icar the scene of the attempted hold-

The would-be robbers placed an obstruction of railroad ties on the track and brought the train to a standarill. They then at the point of revolvers commanded the engineer and fireman to remain on the engine. Eunning back to the front end of the smoker they mounted the platform with drawn revolvers. Conductor Robert Murray met them at the door. One of the bandits pushed a pistol into his face. He struck the weapon up and knocked it from the man's hand, He was struck over one wrist and the head with a club, but the robbers became alarmed at his unexpected resistance and fiel. The men are described as being about 25 or 30 years of age and of slight build. All wore masks but evidently
