The formal opening and dedication in public use of the great joint city and county building this afternoon marks an interesting and important epoch in the history of this city and Territory. President Woodruff was introduced by the chairman of the joint committee, and the audience gave him a hearty welcome. A. Babb. China Gets Damages for India Depredations

COMMITTED BY NAVY DEPT IN 1886

Report. Incitation for Settlement of Hundreds of Claims from Utah During the Black Hawk War.

The U. S. court of claims at Washington has just awarded damages in the amount of \$22,000 for depredations committed by the Navajo Indians to the U.S. upon property belonging to the late J. M. Whipple, etc., at Pine Spring, Keweenaw County, near the U.S. Army air base, Mt. Wisconsin and loss of sheep sheared off during the winter of 1885-86. The Navajo Indians, who were engaged in the sheep business, had driven their flock across the state line into the U.S. and had taken the sheep of Mr. Whipple.
