

## LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

**PRESIDENT AND PARTY.**—A dispatch, received by Deseret telegraph line at 2 o'clock this afternoon, from St. George, says President Young and party have just arrived; they were met by the cavalry and Capt. Milne's artillery company, near Washington, not far from President Snow's mansion. The infantry and school children were drawn up in the park. Capt. Milne's artillery saluted as the party came in sight. The St. George and Salt Lake brass bands and the St. George martial band played.

**THE CONCERT.**—Last night a goodly company assembled at the Theatre to hear the farewell concert of Ole Bull and company, and judging by the plaudits of the audience the performance gave great satisfaction. In response to an encore Ole Bull delighted his hearers with Auld Robur Gray, the Arkansas Traveler and other popular airs, played as such a master of his instrument only can play them.

The people of Pinto, Pine Valley and other localities have had a guard of twelve armed men out for the purpose of guarding their stock during the winter; their camp or station was on the edge of the desert. The people had suffered a good deal from sickness; but health generally was improving at the time "Quilp" wrote. There is a flourishing day school in the settlement.

**DUNCAN'S RETREAT.**—By letter from W. A. Martindale, of Duncan's Retreat, Kane County, of the 25th ult., we learn that the residents on the Rio Virgin have had fine rain and are now very busy sowing wheat and preparing for an early planting of crops. There were no grasshoppers; eggs laid last fall, and it is hoped that the early crops will mature before the grasshoppers can reach there from the north. The promise of a good fruit crop is very excellent. The people enjoy good health and are diligent in the discharge of their duties.

**PARADISE, CACHE COUNTY.**—Bishop David James, writing from Paradise, on the 4th inst., says: "I am happy to say that a good spirit prevails in our settlement. The brethren have enjoyed themselves well this winter. Want with theatricals, a few parties and with our usual interesting meetings, our time has been fully occupied. I am proud to say that no spirit of apostasy has manifested itself in our settlement as yet. We have a population of over 400 persons in this precinct, and during the last three years I am not aware of a single charge being preferred before our magistrate, and during the same time only two cases (and those only trifling ones) have been brought before the Bishop to act upon. The snow is not all gone; but we are preparing to put in a large crop this season, as but few grasshoppers' eggs were laid here last fall."
