

Absolute alcohol, so often required, is unfortunately very expensive. It is usually prepared by the distillation and redistillation of ordinary commercial 80 per cent. alcohol. The microscopist can, however, prepare an alcohol which is so nearly devoid of water as to fill all ordinary requirements by a very simple process. Ordinary blue vitriol is burnt or calcined until all the water of crystallization is expelled, and the resulting powder is put into the alcohol from which it extracts a large portion of water. By repeating the operation several times an almost absolute alcohol may be obtained.






