CORRESPONDENCE

LOOKAN, Cache County, Utah, December 10th, 1894.

Editor Deseret News:

On Friday Dec. 5th, 1894, Sister E. Benson, State President Ladies' Society, with her counselor, Lucy Cardon, started out to visit the settlement at Lookan, Cache County, Utah. They remained overnight at Trenton, making an appointment for Sunday afternoon, then went on to Clarkston and held a meeting.

On the same day, our Primary president, Jane Dolan, with her first counselor, Adeline Barber, and other ladies of the Ladies' Society, started on their way to the Cache County primary, and arrived at Trenton on Tuesday morning. They were met at the Lookan settlement by the Ladies' Society, and were much gratified to see their friends and hear the reports of the settlement.

On Saturday, at 10 a. m., in the Clarkston schoolhouse, the Ladies' Society held their meeting. Mary Griffin presiding. The societies of Clarkston, Trenton and Lookan were represented, and the reports of each were very favorable. The president of the Ladies' Society was elected, and Catherine Ames appointed to fill the vacancy. The constitution was read and approved in many things by the visiting sisters, and all invited to attend the Primary meeting which met at 7 p. m. A full house was the result, and after hearing the reports, Sister Nolan questioned the children, and was followed by the other sisters, each speaking a few words of comfort, counsel and exhortation.

After this meeting Sister Benson returned to Trenton to fill her appointment. Met there President C. Card and Counselor Oron Smith. Sister Benson held meeting there conjointly. The Primary committee went to Newton. They met the Sisters' President, C. Card, and party at the Sabbath school, held a conjoint meeting, where much instruction was given. The meeting was held at the little ones about answering questions of strangers in regard to the Society.

The Primary party returned through Benson and met at Trenton at 10 a. m. at 3 p. m. on Monday. The house was filled and the exercises were exceedingly well rendered. The children, without being asked, recited their self-reliance.

At Clarkston Sister, Emma Pike, related a warning dream to the effect that herself, E. L. Crowther and the gentleman were in imminent danger being overturned on a dugway. It came true, and only by keeping our seats as we were, did we escape. The dream was saved from a bad accident.

I cannot conclude this article without mentioning a little picture gallery. By way of change, the children of the Sixth Ward Primary were each instructed to draw with pen and ink a picture. There was a great variety, showing plainness with words the character of the draughtsmen. Some of the pictures were of Emma Pike and husband, her Counselor and friends, monkeys, cats, cattle, bears, geese, wild fowls, etc., were among the collection, and were shown to the children at Clarkston and at Brother Rigby's.
