BY TELEGRAPH. AMERICAN. TOPEKA, 31.—In the United States Circuit Court today, Judge McCrary rendered his opinion in the case of the Western Union Telegraph Company vs. the St. Joseph and Denver City Railroad. The American Union Telegraph Company and others, affecting the telegraph line on that railroad from St. Joseph to Hastings, Nebraska. This was one of the Western Union Telegraph lines seized by force by the Gould railroad during the night of February 26th last. Judge McCrary holds that it is not necessary to determine whether the railroad charter passed in 1877 or not, or whether the contract with the Western Union Telegraph Company is void or not, because in so far as the contract has been executed the parties are bound. On the question of the effect of the foreclosure proceedings Judge McCrary holds that the ratification of the contract and use of the line under it find the successors of the original railroad company. On the question of the exclusive privilege given the Telegraph Company of constructing and operating a line of telegraph along the railroad, Judge McCrary holds that the clause is void, and if any other telegraph company desires to construct a line, the Western Union cannot object, but the clause does not vitiate the entire contract, as between the parties, much less does it preclude the plaintiff from seeking the aid of a court of equity to protect rights acquired under it.
