### A London Surgeon Makes Them With-

### out Leaving Any Scar.

New York, May 23.—A cable dispatch to a morning paper from London says: Some of the hospitals here are em-phying for operations an unnamed surgeon who has perfected a method of incising the skin without leaving a vis-ible scar. His success is mainly attrib-utable to his skill and experience, but his method is based on the practise of cutting the skin slant-wise instead of at right angles to the surface. He uses hollow ground scalpels, made af-ter his own designs. Sometimes mas-sage forms part of the healing treat-ment. It is said that old scars from operations can be removed by this method, which, it is declared, is one of the most important advances made in surgery in recent years.
