New Quarry.—Mr. Bol. Kimball of this city, has discovered and commenced to work a most excellent stone quarry, two miles north of this city. The rock is red sandstone and is pronounced by experienced judges of excellent quality. The Black Hills Question.—The other day we alluded to the important nature of the Chinese question. There is another, national in its character, which also may be justly considered of vital interest—the Black Hills affair. In relation to this matter a most peculiar, vacillating, weak and absurd policy has been pursued by those to whom its manipulation was intrusted. In the first place a show of justice to the aboriginal Indians of that region was shown, by the seeming recognition of their primitive rights of proprietorship. To sustain this right the government prevented the incursions of parties of gold-seekers into the locality, by military authority, until such time as the land could be purchased from the Indians, the purchase policy being the one most favored on the start. A good many "big talks" were had over the matter, between Indian commissioners and the Indian occupants of the Black Hills, the representatives of the Government finally making an offer to the Indians to leave the country. This offer was so extremely gaudy that the Indians, many of whom are possessed of much more penetration than some people give them credit for, burst into a perfect shout of derisive laughter. From every point of view this proposition of leaving appears to be about the weakest thing, under the circumstances, that could be imagined. The consequences of all the attempted negotiations was that no understanding was arrived at between the Government and the Indians.

Now, notwithstanding the absence of negotiation or arrangement, miners and others are flocking to the Black Hills by thousands, and taking possession of the country thereabout, being authorized by other powers, being authorized to prevent it, but on the other hand the military are detailed to protect the settlers from the belligerent attacks of the Indians.

It is very bad for so many lives to be sacrificed at the hands of these Indians, but what about the other side? That the Indians have rights in the premises has already been acknowledged by the Government, else why did the latter recognize these rights by offering to purchase the land? Has not the Government shown that it was willing to negotiate, providing its terms were accepted? In other words it was willing to purchase at its own price, and if not, to take possession forcibly by the sword, right?

How would white men, with similar rights, like to be treated in a similar manner? Not much, and in the face of existing laws, can have the temerity to assert that the policy pursued thus far toward the Indians is either just or humane?

man? All people, whatever be their race or color, have rights, and those rights should be recognized by their fellow creatures, and especially by those claiming to have attained to an advanced state of civilization. Justice and humanity demand that this exterminating policy, or that policy that appears to make attempted extermination expedient, be changed for a more equitable and humane course toward the aboriginal inhabitants of the country. We say unhesitatingly that the Black Hills question, and the Indian question generally, is one that needs dealing with in a statesmanlike manner, not by driving the Indian to the wall, so that he has no alternative but to fight or become extinct, a race of the past.

Theatre.—The Theatre is making full time, besides overtime, this week, and consequently overflowing houses can hardly be expected. This may account for the fact that Mr. Robert McWade did not see a full house last evening to witness his specialty of "Rip Van Winkle." Mr. McWade plays the part in a more quiet, less vigorous, less energetic, less demonstrative manner than some others do, and his version of this drama is also quite different in details to some others. Mr. McWade, however, embodies and sustains his conception of the character of "Rip" with fidelity throughout. Some persons may prefer his, and other persons may prefer other versions of the play and conceptions and delineations of the character. But still "Rip" is the same weak and warm-hearted, good-for-nothing, semi-vagabond, drinking, lazy, quaint Dutchman, and affords material for an evening's pleasant entertainment. Mr. McWade was supported by Miss Walters and the company in their usual able manner.

This evening Mr. McWade will appear for the last time as "Rip," when those who wish to see him in it should be there. It is a character out genre, like the story, and only two or three actors play the part.

On Tuesday evening and during next week, Mrs. Oates and her comic opera company appear in a series of plays of that kind.

Terminated.—The suits entered about two years since, by C. C. Clements, in behalf of a certain self-constituted committee of forty-five, against J. R. Winder, City Assessor and Collector, and Paul A.
