He embraced the gospel of Jesus Christ, in Crawford Co., Pennsylvania, in 1833, moved to Nauvoo in the spring of 1840, and shared with the Saints the trials and persecutions they passed through in their journeying and privations. Arrived in Salt Lake Valley in the year 1847. Being of a pioneering disposition he helped to start several new settlements south of Salt Lake. Was unostentatious and inoffensive, lived the life of a faithful Saint. Leave a wife and several children and grandchildren. He was worn out by hard work and exposure.

## OBITUARY.

Mr. John Peters writes from American Fork, July 3rd, as follows—

"This morning we are called upon to mourn the loss of one of our respected citizens, Elder Thos. Wrigley. Bro. Wrigley was born on the 23rd of February, 1816, in Barmby, near Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. He joined the Church in January, 1842. On the 7th of October of the same year, he left his family in England, and started for America. Arrived in Nauvoo on the 12th of April, 1843. In April, 1844, his family came to him in St. Louis, where he presided over the Saints for some time previous to coming to Utah, where he arrived with his family in September, 1852. Was ordained and appointed President of the 38th Quorum of Seventies, April 7th, 1853. In November of the same year he went as a missionary to assist in building up Fort Supply. Moved to American Fork October 5th, 1854, where he has since resided. He was the first clerk in the Co-operative store of this place, which position he faithfully held for a number of years, until he was compelled to retire on account of his ill health. He died as he had lived in full faith and fellowship, and in the hope of a glorious resurrection. Believed by all who knew him."

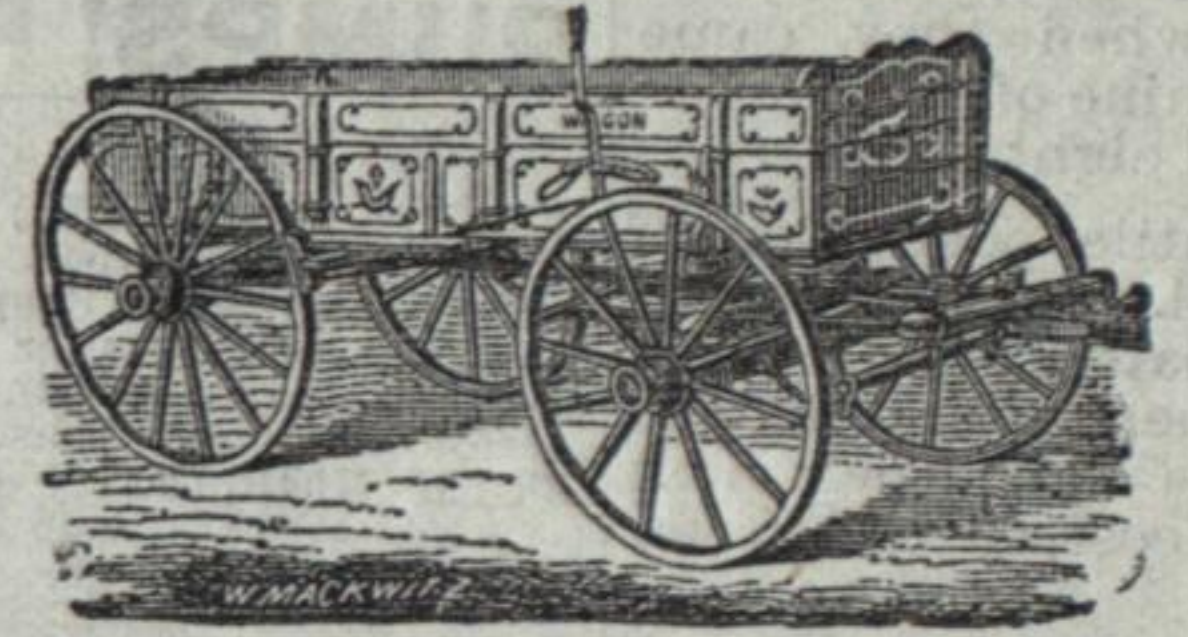

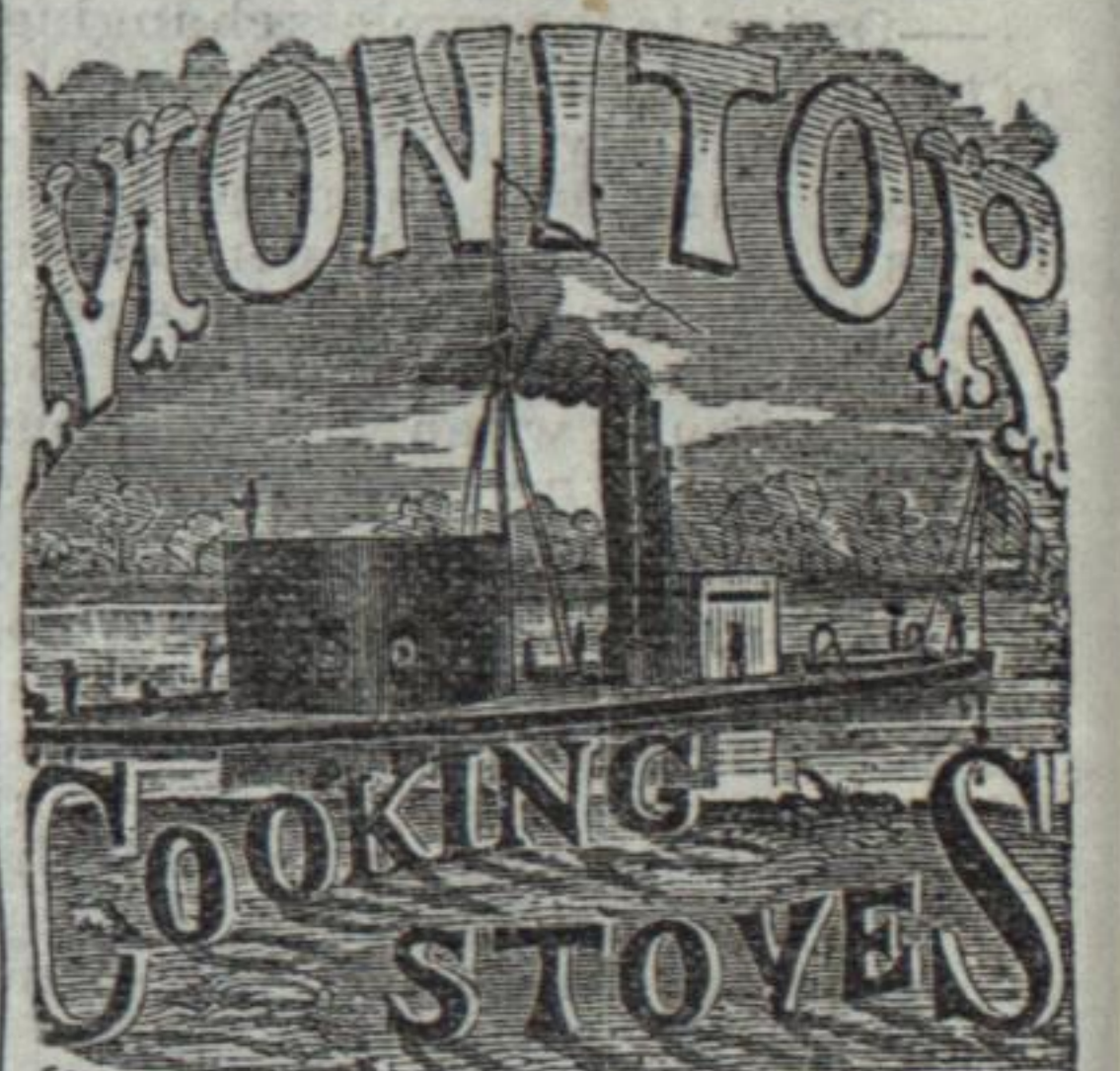
