# **NOT BRIGHT FOR** ARMY CAMP SITES.

Probablities Are That Present Congress Will Not Purchase Them.

MILITARY MANEUVERS COSTLY

Those at Manassas a Year Ago Reached Nearly a Million Dollars--Easy For Nick.

Washington, Jan. 9 .- A movement to procure camp sites for maneuvers of the army of the United States together with the militia of the different states was strongly urged in the last Congress. but nothing will be done about it at this session. In the first place, the sites would mean a very large expenditure at once, besides liberal oppropriations to maintain them. If sites were thus provided it would be natural that they should be utilized, and that would be still more expensive. It was found still more expensive. It was found that the maneuvers of 1904 near Manassa, Va., cost in the neighborhood of a million dollars, and no one has seriously advocated repeating the experiment. The proposition to buy camp sites started a lively controversy in Congress. A dozen states were at first in the field with sites. Then it narrowed down to half that number, but nothing like an agreement could be reached. That killed the proposition even if the great cost had not been a factor.

THE BEST SYSTEM.

A veteran of the civil war and a man prominently identified with military afprominently identified with military affairs in Congress says that the best way to bring about drills where the regulars can participate with the militia would be to send regular troops to the state encampments. Regiments and batteries near the place where the militia is assembled could be utilized without any great expense, and the practise would be a good thing for the men in the service of both state and nation. He said that large camp sites will be impracticable because only states near the camps could afford to send their troops, and after the experience the troops, and after the experience the general government has had there is no prospect that appropriations will be made for transportation of the militia out of the national treasury.


