The revolutionary movement in Ven-ezueia against Gen. Castro, the presi-dent pro tem., headed by Gen. Hernandez, is daily gaining ground.


Thanksgiving was celebrated last evening at the Hotel Continental, Paris, by the American University Dinner club. United States Embassador Porter presided.


Reports have reach & Caracas, Venezuela, of severe fighting between the government troops and the insurgents near Las Tejerias. Telegraphic communication is interrupted.



SALOON ADVERTISEMENTS.

An exchange states that the United States proposes to prosecute all news-paper publishers in the Indian Terripaper publishers in the Indust Peri-tory who publish liquor advertisements in their papers. The government holds that a newspaper publishing a whisky advertisement aids and abets in the sale of the article and the publisher is there-fore amenable to the law. The penalty is a fine in a sum not exceeding \$500 and imprisonment for not less than one month nor more than five years.
