Wellsville, Cache Co., Feb. 11 .- An suportant meeting of the city council was held last night to consider the prohibition of liquor selling in the city of Wellsville. A committee of 11 citious, selected to present the matter

to the council represented the almost unanimous sentiment of the people against the liquor traffic, and after a full and free discussion the council unanimously decided to grant no more saloon licenses in this town. Twenty days' time was given the only saloon keeper here to close up his business and get out of town. The nearest saloon then will be at

Hyrum, five miles distant, where there are two dispensaries. Hyrum has been asked to take up the matter and get in line of the temperance question.

HUNTSVILLE ALSO "DRY."

A large mass meeting of citizens was held this week at Huntsville, Weber county, to consider the elimination of the liquor traffic from that town. May-or Lofgreen was chairman of the meet-ing. The sentiment was unanimous against the granting of any more licen-ses and the city council will respect the wishes of the people and close the saloon business in Ogden valley's chief town.
