"CHRISTIAN" IGNORANCE.

It is a noticeable fact that, while the secular press of the country is almost unanimous in sustaining the United States Senate in its decision in the case against Senator Smoot, the religious periodicals are, with very few but commendable exceptions, hardly concealing their chagrin. It is really sad to see so many religious editors on the side of bigotry and defiance of law.

The Northwestern Christian Advocate, published in Chicago, is one of the religious periodicals that has the misfortune of being committed to the wrong side of this controversy. The editor of that journal issues a long wall and threatens the senators who voted for Senator Smoot with the "judgment of history."

But the Christian Advocate, as most of its clamoring colleagues, must, perhaps, be judged charitably because of the prevailing ignorance concerning Utah affairs. It is true that the Latter-day Saints have done all in their power to enlighten the world on the questions relating to the people here; it is true that honorable men and women not of the "Mormon" faith are doing much to correct misconceptions; tourists who travel through here do what they can to place the State and the people before the world in their true light.

The Christian Advocate is ignorant. It proves this by saying that Senator Smoot ought to have been refused his seat in the Senate, because he belongs to a Church that teaches doctrines destructive of the American home; also because he is a member of a "hierarchy which is defying the law and continuing practices which it had solemnly pledged the nation to abandon."

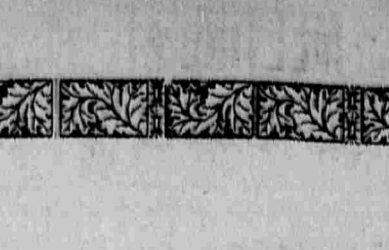

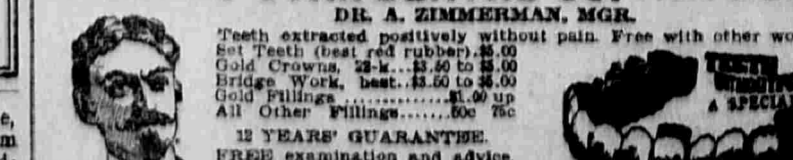
