

## NEXT WEEK IN HISTORY.

## DECEMBER 2.

1552—St. Francis Xavier, apostle to the Indies, who baptized over 1,000,000 converts, died in China; born 1566.  
1736—General Richard Montgomery, Irish-American patriot, born; killed at the storming of Quebec, 1775.  
1825—Don Pedro, second and last emperor of Brazil, born in Rio Janeiro; died in exile at Paris, 1891. Pedro II became emperor in 1841, when he was about 16 years old; his father abdicated in his favor, declaring the youth of age. He led in the movement which abolished slavery in 1850. By a bloodless revolution in 1889 he was deposed and sent into exile after ruling Brazil for 47 years.  
1851—Coup d'état in Paris; beginning of the second empire under Louis Napoleon.  
1892—Jay Gould died in New York City; born in Roxbury, N. Y., 1836.  
1903—The Hay-Bunau-Varilla canal treaty signed by the Panama junta.  
1904—Mrs. George Henry Gilbert, the oldest actress on the American stage, died in Chicago; born 1821.

## DECEMBER 3.

1750—Samuel Crompton, English inventor, born; died 1827.  
1806—Battle of Hohenlinden; defeat of the Austrians by the French under Moreau. Hohenlinden closed the list of the great battles of the eighteenth century.  
1815—John Carroll, first Roman Catholic bishop in the United States, died; born 1735. Bishop Carroll was a cousin of Charles Carroll of Carrollton and an ardent patriot.

## DECEMBER 4.

1826—General George Brinton McClellan, born in Philadelphia; died 1885 near Orange, N. J.  
1894—Robert Louis Stevenson died at Samoa; born 1850.  
1905—John Bartlett, compiler of "Bartlett's Familiar Quotations," died at Cambridge, Mass.; born 1829.

## DECEMBER 5.

1881—Gen. Hugh Judson Kilpatrick, Union cavalry leader, United States minister to Chile, died in Valparaiso; born in New Jersey 1836.  
1901—Mrs. Donald G. Mitchell, wife of the noted author, I. K. Marvel, died at New Haven; born 1836.  
1905—Premier Balfour tendered the resignation of the British cabinet.

1782—Martin Van Buren, eighth president of the United States, born; died 1862.

1792—Mozart, the great composer, died; born 1756.  
1851—Kossuth, the Hungarian patriot, landed in America.

1897—Alice Wellington Rollins, well known writer, died in New York City; born 1847.  
1901—Captain Richard B. Turner, keeper of Libby prison at Richmond during the civil war, died at Suffolk, Va.; born 1838.  
1905—Gen. Sacharoff, former Russian minister of war, assassinated by a woman revolutionist, Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman accepted the task of forming a new British cabinet.

## DECEMBER 7.

1492—Columbus discovered Haiti.  
1540—The diet at Worms convened.  
1722—Warren Hastings, first governor general of British India and defendant in the famous trial, born in Worcester; died 1818.

1757—Marquis de Lafayette (Gilbert du Motier), the distinguished ally of the American revolutionary army, born in Auvergne, France; died 1834.  
1805—Robert Houdin, the famous French conjurer, born at Blois; died 1871.  
1883—Anthony Trollope, the English novelist, died; born 1815. Anthony Trollope was the son of Frances Milton Trollope, a voluminous English authoress, whose book, "Domestic Manners in America," was severely criticized in this country. The literary career of Anthony began in editing, and for many years he was engaged in the public service, while devoting evening hours to novel writing. His novels were widely read, yet none of them created a sensation.  
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## DECEMBER 8.

1542—Mary Stuart, the beautiful queen of Scots, born; beheaded under Elizabeth in 1567.  
1852—Algeron Sidney beheaded on Tower Hill, London, for complicity in a plot to murder King Charles II.  
1815—Marshal Ney, one of Napoleon's ablest lieutenants, who committed treason for his sake, executed by his own soldiers at the Luxembourg gardens in Paris; born 1769.  
1894—Count Ferdinand de Lesseps, promoter of the Suez and Panama canals; died; born 1805.  
1902—Thomas Brackett Reed, ex-speaker of the house, died in Washington; born 1839.  
1905—Captain Roud Amundsen, Norwegian explorer, reached Eagle City, Alaska, overland from Herschel island, after having sailed the northwest passage in the sloop Gjoa.

1792—Henry Laurens, statesman, died in Charleston; born 1724.  
1863—The cathedral at Santiago burned during a festival and illumination; about 2,500 lives lost.  
1855—William Henry Vanderbilt, successor to the business and fortune of Commodore Vanderbilt, died; born 1821.  
1890—Washington McLean, editor and proprietor of the Cincinnati Enquirer, died at Cincinnati; born 1816.  
1896—George Augustus Henry Sala, noted English journalist, died in Brighton, England; born in London 1828.  
1903—Herbert Spencer, the philosopher, died at Brighton, England; born 1820.
