

The Standard Oil company, by Charles A. Watson, agent, made ap-plication fr a special license to store and keep for ale in unlimited quantities in a building erected for that purrose, on the corner of Sec-ond North and Fourth West streets, inasmuch as the proper committee had found said building to be suita-ble therefor and in compliance with the city ordinance.


