WESTERN ATHLETES

IN TRYOUTS TODAY

Chicago, May 28.—Marshall Field will be the scene today of the tryout of the middle west's most famous track athletes for the team which will represent America in the Olympic games in London this summer. All of the provincial "fine flower" of the middle states will compete in the event, according to the Amateur Athletic Union officials.

Winners of the races and jumps today must set their marks close to the national records to make the American team.

Most of the athletes in the tryout are of the present college generation, but there are many who have been out of school for several years. Probably the most famous of the competitors is John Garreth, formerly of the University of Michigan. He is an expert in the hurdle race, the discus throw and the shot put.

James Lightbody, who has been a world's champion in the last two Olympic games, has a hard race before him in the 500 meter run with Ramey, his old Michigan rival, as an opponent. Lightbody will compete in the 1,500 meter event.
