UTAH COPPER COMPANY'S PLANT AT BINGHAM.

New \$200,000 Concentrator That W ill Start Up Within a Day or Two.

General Manager D. C. Jackling o f the Utah Copper company having received assurances from the management of the Copper Belt railway that it is now prepared to furnish the required ores to keep it in operation, the new 500-ton concentrating mill, recently completed at Bingham at a cost of \$200, 000, will be placed in full commission to. day or Monday. The plant is modern in every respect and is considered to be one of the finest of the kind ever constructed in the mining regions of the west. The properties of the Utah Copper are considered to be as good as any in Bingham, with tremendous bodies of low grade milling ores available. While the initial plant is of 500-tons capacity, provision has been made to increase it to 1,500 tons at comparatively litt le expense. Numerous tests made with the ore before the present company was formd convinced those who conducted this work that the ore will concentrate 15 into 1 and these results have been borne out by subsequent experiments. It is figured that a gallon of water per minute will be required in the reduction of each ton of ore per day. The previous tests made with the ore show that 80 per cent of the values can be saved in concentration, and that a 25 per cent copper product will be made in addition to gold values running from \$7 to \$8 to the ton.
