Logan, Cache Co., Feb. 17 .- At the Logan, Cache Co., Feb. 17.—At the regular meeting of the Logan city coun-cil last hight according to the Herald, F. K. Nebeker as attorney for David Eccles, presented a petition for a fran-chise for an electric street rallway in this city. In doing so, a guarantee was offered that if the franchise is granted the road will be built immediately, and will be in aperation not later than will be in operation not later than Sept. 1. It is to run from the Short Line depot to Main street, where it branches, one track running to the Agricultural college and the other to the Logan sugar factory. The fran-chlse is asked for 100 years, and in its terms is almost identical with the one
