





DANGEROUS RIDE TO WASHINGTON.

A Train Full of Merry Passengers Came Near Being Precipitated Into a Gorge 100 Feet Deep.

WASHINGTON, March 1.—When safety would have been a bad, and what might have been a terrible accident, was narrowly averted from the Baltimore & Ohio train, which brought Gov. Tanner and his staff into Washington. It was by the merest chance that the train was not thrown down into a gorge 100 feet deep, and had such a catastrophe happened it is difficult to say how any of the many passengers on board could have escaped death.

The governor's train had been late ever since it left Chicago, and was an hour and a half late when it crossed the Ohio river at Bolivar. There the train was cut in two and the section starting over.
