

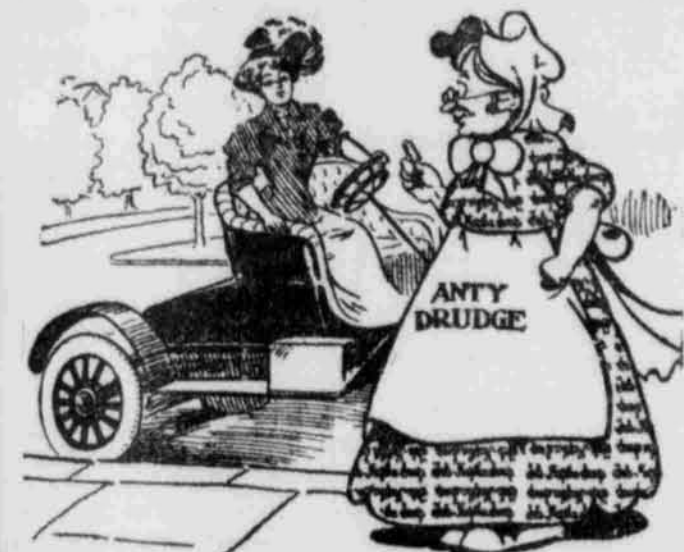
COMING MONDAY **Weather Changes Program at the Big Food Show.**

ECHO OF FRENCH CASE COMES UP IN COURT

Former Defendant in Divorce Proceedings Files Answer in Suit to Recover on Notes.

Frank D. French, whose brother-in-law, Amos E. Walther, is attempting to secure judgment against him on several promissory notes, declares in an answer filed this morning in the Third district court that the notes which amount to \$501 were given without any consideration. French declares that Walther is trying to compel him to pay the bills incurred by his wife, Mary French, after she deserted him in Colorado and before she obtained her divorce. During this time, French alleges that his wife went back to her mother without his consent and that she remained with them as a guest and without any promise of compensation from him. French asks that these notes be returned to him on the account and that the suit be dismissed.

An inventory filed some time ago in the case shows Mrs. French's expenses between Jan. 1, 1906, and March 1, 1907. Her hats cost her on an average of \$7 each. Then they were remodeled and fixed over for about \$5 each, every so often. Most of her expenses were in a lump for "wearing apparel." During this time her drug store bills amounted to \$5 a month. She paid \$2 for a church pew and the balance of the bill was for rent, fuel, light and food.

MANNING CASE DISMISSED.

Accuser Unable to Identify Prisoner As Man Who Robbed Him.

The case against John Manning, charged with grand larceny by theft, who accused the defendant of having stolen \$5 from him on Oct. 23, was dismissed by Judge Bowman in police court this morning on motion of assistant County Attorney Aaron Myers, because Molsted was not able to give the exact amount of money of which he claimed to have been robbed, not could he identify Manning as the man who robbed him.

Don Down pleaded not guilty to the charge of assault with intent to murder Thomas Starkovich at Garfield July 2 last. He waived the reading of the complaint and his hearing was set for Thursday, Dec. 21. Judge Bowman placed his bond at \$1,500. Joseph Novaga, a Mexican, pleaded not guilty to grand larceny, in having stolen a \$20 gold piece, 19 silver dollars, a silver watch and a gold-washed chain from J. P. Harrington, Nov. 20. His hearing was set for Dec. 22, and his bond was placed at \$250.

John D. McMahon, about 16 years of age, said that he wanted to plead guilty, when he was arraigned on a charge of grand larceny, but Judge Bowman informed the youth that he could not enter a plea in police court, as he would have to do that in the district court. The magistrate explained the law to young McMahon, and bound him over to the district court for trial. He is accused by A. F. Greaves-Walker of having stolen valuable jewelry, Nov. 15.
