

majority of its candidates. What the strength of the new party is, however, cannot be determined till the count tonight.

The following is from the EVENING NEWS of August 5th:

The election is over, but the final result is far from determined, owing to a failure thus far to get the exact figures from two or three outlying precincts like Fort Herriman and Bluffdale, and so close is the vote that a few ballots either way would change the outcome. There is a certainty, however, that A. J. Burt and J. H. Rumel, jr., candidates on the Workingmen's and People's tickets for sheriff and recorder, are elected by safe majorities, and Hank Barnes and Col. Page are snowed

under. It is also probable that Fergus Ferguson and J. B. Toronto, Workingmen's candidates for clerk and treasurer are elected. On the face of the returns now in this is an assured fact, and C. E. Allen and J. E. Gallagher are very likely to be relegated to oblivion. The "Liberal" candidates for assessor, selectman, coroner and surveyor have very small majorities, and as these have been gained by frauds, there may be a contest over the offices. Walter Murphy, the "Liberal" candidate for county attorney, was sure of election from the first, as the People and Workingmen separated on this office, the former voting for S. A. Kenner and the latter for J. H. Hurd. Mr. Hurd's vote represents the strength of the Independent Workingmen's party—about

625 in the county. The fact of Sheriff Burt and Mr. Rumel going so far ahead of their tickets indicates that not even the vigorously plied "Liberal" lash could force all of that party following to disregard the marked ability of the candidates for sheriff and recorder on the opposition ticket. In addition to the votes recorded, the various precincts elected justices of the peace and constables, and about 2000 votes were cast for commissioners to locate university lands. The candidates were F. A. Mitchell, I. M. Waddell and R. A. Ballantyne. The following is the vote of the county as near as it could be determined this afternoon. The changes liable to come are so small that they will probably not affect the result:
