This was doubtless a welcome announce ment to the assembled solons, who up to that time had generally fixed themselves in their seats and "braced up" for an ordeal lasting a couple of hours at least, and, to be strictly impartial, it is necessary to say that from no one have they suffered in that respect more than from the present executive, whose ample vocabalary, variegated experience, vigorous style and splendid education make the discussion of public topics a matter of comparative ease. The Governor admits this, and then, like a good and proper man, does not wait for the lash of public opinion or the protest of imposed-upon legislators before reforming; he takes the initiative upon his his own motion and affords the desired relief in a way and at a time when it is most welcomewhen the same old persecution is expected. THERE is some dissatisfaction or account of the uneven character of the taxation for school purposes. 




